AS INTRODUCED

A Joint Resolution relating to certain rules of the Department of Labor; disapproving proposed amendments to permanent rules OAC 380:55-1-2, OAC 380:55-13-1, OAC 380:55-13-10, OAC 380:55-15-3, proposed permanent rule OAC 380:55-1-3 and the revocation of permanent rule OAC 380:55-13-11 regarding amusement ride safety rules; directing distribution; and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sections 250.2 and 308 of Title 75 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the Legislature reserves the right to designate the method for rule promulgation, establish policy, determine that a rule is inconsistent with legislative intent and disapprove any rule or any portion thereof; and

WHEREAS, on March 25, 1998, the Department of Labor adopted proposed amendments to permanent rules OAC 380:55-1-2, OAC 380:55-13-1, OAC 380:55-13-10, OAC 380:55-15-3, proposed permanent rule OAC 380:55-1-3 and the revocation of permanent rule OAC 380:55-13-11, regarding amusement ride safety rules, relating to definitions, competent operator, maintenance, waiver self-inspection frequency, owner responsibility and operators, and on March 30, 1998, the agency submitted the rules to the Legislature for its review; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that the proposed amendments to permanent rules OAC 380:55-1-2, OAC 380:55-13-1, OAC 380:55-13-

10, OAC 380:55-15-3, proposed permanent rule OAC 380:55-1-3 and the revocation of permanent rule OAC 380:55-13-11 are inconsistent with legislative intent.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 46TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

SECTION 1. The Legislature hereby disapproves proposed amendments to permanent rules OAC 380:55-1-2, OAC 380:55-13-1, OAC 380:55-13-10, OAC 380:55-15-3, proposed permanent rule OAC 380:55-1-3 and the revocation of permanent rule OAC 380:55-13-11.

SECTION 2. The Secretary of State is hereby directed to distribute copies of this resolution to the Governor, the Labor Commissioner and the Editor of "The Oklahoma Register".

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
