AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to crimes and punishments;

prohibiting possession or use of device to detect
bodywire on undercover peace officer; stating
penalty; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 593 of Title 21, unless there is
created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

It is unlawful for any person to possess or use a device for the
purpose of detecting a bodywire or other electronic transmitter or
recorder on an undercover peace officer or any narcotics agent of a
state or federal government. Upon conviction, the violator shall be
guilty of a Schedule G felony.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 1998.
