AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Capitol Complex

Centennial Commission; amending Section 4, Chapter 358, O.S.L. 1996 (73 O.S. Supp. 1996, Section 98.3), which relates to duties of the Commission; authorizing subcommittees; providing for certain members; authorizing reimbursement for certain expenses; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 4, Chapter 358, O.S.L. 1996 (73 O.S. Supp. 1996, Section 98.3), is amended to read as follows:

Section 98.3 A. Duties of the Capitol Complex Centennial Commission shall be to devise a master plan to make capital improvements on the grounds and structures of the Capitol Complex. The Commission shall devise a timetable for completion for all parts of such plan. The Commission shall also plan festivities for the state's centennial celebration.

B. To perform its duties, the Commission is authorized to appoint subcommittees which may include persons who are not members of the Commission. Such persons shall not be entitled to

compensation but shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as provided by the State Travel Reimbursement Act, Section 500.1 et seq. of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Such reimbursement shall be paid by the Department of Central Services.

C. The Department of Central Services shall provide support for the Commission and shall budget and expend funds appropriated to the Department by the Legislature for the Commission's activities.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
