AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to state government; amending 74 O.S. 1991, Section 1806.1, which relates to seasonal employees; increasing hours worked by seasonal employees within the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 1991, Section 1806.1, is amended to read as follows:

Section 1806.1 A. The Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department is authorized to employ seasonal employees throughout the calendar year; provided, however, the total hours worked shall not exceed eleven hundred and ninety-nine (1199) hours for each twelve-month period based on the employee's entry-on-duty date.

B. Project labor ~~employed used~~ by the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department ~~for a period of time necessary to complete a project~~ shall be in the unclassified service of the state ~~as provided by the Oklahoma Personnel Act, Section 840.1 et seq. of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes.~~

~~Such~~ C. Seasonal and project labor employees shall not be entitled to paid leave, paid holidays, retirement, health, dental or life insurance, and shall be exempt from any laws, rules or practices providing for such benefits.

D. The Department shall include in its annual budget request a summary of the use of seasonal employees and project labor laborers, which shall include the number of workers employed under the provisions of this section and the total wages paid to these employees.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 1997.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
