AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 1991, Section 1114, which relates to the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration Act; requiring certain documents to be presented when obtaining replacement license plate or decal; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 1991, Section 1114, is amended to read as follows:

Section 1114. In the event of loss, mutilation, or destruction of a license plate or decal, the owner of ~~such~~ the registered vehicle shall file an affidavit showing such fact and obtain another plate or decal. The charge shall be Four Dollars (\$4.00) for each such plate or decal. Prior to such plate or decal being issued, the owner of the registered vehicle shall present identification containing a photograph of the owner, which shall correspond with the name in which the vehicle is titled according to the records of the motor license agent or other registering agency, and shall certify the existence of security on the vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Section 7-602 of this title; provided, in lieu of surrendering to the motor license agent or other registering agency a current owner's security verification form or an equivalent form

issued by the Department of Public Safety as required in Section 7-602 of this title, the motor license agent or other registering agency may make a photocopy of the owner's form carried in the vehicle and return the original form to the owner.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 1997.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
