AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to benefits; amending 74 O.S. 1991, Section 1307, which relates to continuation of life insurance benefits; increasing the basic life insurance amount for employees of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol and Department of Corrections; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 1991, Section 1307, is amended to read as follows:

Section 1307. A. The specifications drawn by the Board for the Health Insurance Plan shall provide for comprehensive hospital medical and surgical benefits. The Health Insurance Plan may limit coverage for a particular illness, disease, injury or condition; but, except for such limits, shall not exclude or limit particular services or procedures that can be provided for the diagnosis and treatment of an illness, disease, injury or condition, so long as the services and procedures provided are of sound efficacy, are medically necessary, and fall within the licensed scope of practice of the practitioner providing same. The Health Insurance Plan may provide for the application of deductibles and copayment or coinsurance provisions, when equally applied to all covered charges for services and procedures that can be provided by any practitioner

for the diagnosis and treatment of a particular illness, disease, injury or condition.

B. The Life Insurance Plan shall include Accidental Death and Dismemberment Benefits and additional optional life insurance coverage.

C. The basic life insurance amount shall be Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) for uniformed members of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol and correctional officers of the Department of Corrections.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective on November 1, 1997.
