AMENDMENT NO. 1. Strike the stricken title, enacting clause  
and entire bill and insert

"( schools - cardiopulmonary resuscitation programs -

training - effective date -

emergency )

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 1991, Section 1210.199, is  
amended to read as follows:

Section 1210.199 A. All students enrolled in physical  
education in classes in grades nine through twelve in the public  
schools of this state may receive instruction in the techniques of  
cardiopulmonary resuscitation sufficient to enable such students to  
give emergency assistance to victims of cardiac arrest.

B. A number of teachers, including those serving as coaches,  
and support personnel, including those serving as bus drivers, as  
defined in Section 1-116 of this title which equals an employee to  
student ratio of 1:50 shall receive instruction in the  
administration of first aid and techniques of cardiopulmonary

resuscitation, to meet the requirements of Public Law 91-596, as amended, also known as the Williams-Steiger Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970. School districts may use state funds allocated to the school district for professional development to pay for or to reimburse teachers and support personnel for the training required by this subsection.

C. The State Department of Education may administer the cardiopulmonary resuscitation instruction program and train teaching personnel pursuant to ~~regulations~~ rules adopted by the State Board of Education. Teaching materials and training courses provided by the American Red Cross, the American Heart Association and similar organizations may be utilized.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 1999.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval."
