An Act relating to public health and safety;  
expanding Medicaid coverage to certain persons;  
requiring the provision of pharmacy benefits to  
certain persons; providing for suspension of  
coverage; setting limitations; providing for  
codification; providing an effective date; and  
declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5009.5 of Title 63, unless there  
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The Oklahoma Health Care Authority shall provide Medicaid  
coverage, including but not limited to, pharmacy benefits for up to  
three prescription medications per month, to those categorically  
needy aged and disabled individuals whose income is at or below one  
hundred percent (100%) of the federal poverty level. The pharmacy  
benefits authorized by this section shall be suspended in the event  
that the federal government extends pharmacy benefits to this  
population.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2000.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby

declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
