An Act relating to motor vehicles; requiring passengers in vehicles involved in accidents to render aid or give information under certain circumstances; providing for punishment; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 10-104.1 of Title 47, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Any passenger in a vehicle involved in an accident wherein the driver of such vehicle is required by any section of this title to stop and render aid to an injured person or furnish information to the driver of the other vehicle or to a law enforcement officer shall, in the event of the refusal, neglect or inability of such driver to render such aid or give such information, insofar as is possible and reasonable under the circumstances, render such aid to any injured person and furnish such information to the driver of the other vehicle or to a law enforcement officer, and upon failure to do so shall be guilty of the same offense and subject to the same punishment as would the driver had such driver willfully violated any such requirement.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2000.
