BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY

SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2000, the
Department of Environmental Quality shall budget all funds in the
following categories and amounts:

SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not
otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed
upon the Department of Environmental Quality by law shall be set by
the Executive Director of the Department of Environmental Quality.

The salary of the Executive Director of the Department of Environmental Quality shall not exceed _____ Dollars (\$0.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2000. The Department of Environmental Quality for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2000, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:
