

ENGROSSED SENATE

An Act relating to motor vehicles; prohibiting registration of golf carts as motor vehicles; authorizing operation of golf carts on city streets under certain circumstances; providing certain prohibition; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1151.1 of Title 47, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, golf carts shall not be registered pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration Act.

B. Except as otherwise provided in this section, golf carts shall not be operated on the highways or turnpikes of the state.

C. Golf carts may be operated on city streets if:

1. The municipal governing body has adopted an ordinance governing the operation of golf carts on city streets; and

2. Operation occurs during daylight hours only.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
