

ENGROSSED SENATE
BILL NO. 449

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-113.1 of Title 70, unless
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A person between the ages of five (5) and nineteen (19) years
who is not enrolled in a public school and is schooled by
alternative method may enroll in up to one-half of a day of classes,
or the equivalent for those schools using other than a standard
schedule, in the district of residence. Parents or guardians
desiring to enroll a student pursuant to this section shall notify
the district forty-five (45) days prior to a semester inception.
The superintendent may waive this requirement.

For purposes of this section a school day shall be as defined in
Section 1-111 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 18-201.2 of Title 70, unless
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The State Aid for a school district shall be increased by an
amount equal to the percent of the total school day enrolled of the
Base Foundation Support Level for each person between the ages of

five (5) and nineteen (19) years who is schooled by alternative method and enrolls in up to one-half of a day of classes, or the equivalent for those schools using other than a standard schedule, in that district as authorized in Section 1 of this act.

For purposes of this section a school day shall be as defined in Section 1-111 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 1999.

SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
