BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2001, the
Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control shall
budget all funds in the following categories and amounts:

The agency shall develop outcome-based performance measures for
each budget category.

SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not
otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed
upon the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs
Control by law shall be set by the Commissioner of Public Safety.
The salary of the Director shall not exceed _____
Dollars (\$0.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year
ending June 30, 2001. The Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and
Dangerous Drugs Control for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2001,
shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-

time-equivalent employees, except hours coded as overtime wages, and expenditures excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2000.

SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
