BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

OFFICE OF JUVENILE AFFAIRS

SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2001, the Office of Juvenile Affairs shall budget all funds in the following categories and amounts:

SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Office of Juvenile Affairs by law shall be set by the

Director of the Office of Juvenile Affairs. The salary of the Director of the Office of Juvenile Affairs shall not exceed _____ Dollars (\$0.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2001. The Office of Juvenile Affairs for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2001, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:
