An Act relating to the Constitutional Reserve Fund;
making an appropriation to the Oklahoma Historical
Society; stating purpose; making appropriation
nonfiscal; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Oklahoma
Historical Society from any monies not otherwise appropriated from
the Constitutional Reserve Fund of the State Treasury, the sum of
Two Million Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$2,300,000.00) or so

much thereof as may be necessary for the Oklahoma City National Memorial.

SECTION 2. The appropriation made by this act shall not be subject to fiscal year limitations and shall be available for encumbrance and expenditure purposes for a period of thirty (30) months from the date this act is approved.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
