An Act relating to roads, bridges and ferries; designating portions of U.S. Highway 59 in Sequoyah County, U.S. Highway 271, U.S. Highway 59, and U.S. Highway 259 in LeFlore County as the "Mountain Gateway"; requiring the Department of Transportation to cause suitable permanent markers to be placed upon the highway bearing such name; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1633 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

U.S. Highway 59 south of Interstate 40 in Sequoyah County, U.S. Highway 271, U.S. Highway 59, and U.S. Highway 259 within the boundaries of LeFlore County shall be designated as the "Mountain Gateway" in an attempt to increase tourism in Eastern Oklahoma by promoting mountains as a tourist attraction in that part of the state. The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers to be placed upon the highway bearing such name.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
