A Concurrent Resolution proclaiming April 20, 1999,  
as "Roy Peters Day" in the State of Oklahoma;  
thanking Dr. Roy Peters Jr. for his many years of  
public service; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, Roy Peters Jr. is a native of Alex in Grady County,  
Oklahoma. His father was a school superintendent in Grady County  
and his mother was a classroom teacher for forty-one years. Peters  
was an All-Conference center on the Alex High School football team

and a National President of the Future Business Leaders of America; and

WHEREAS, Roy Peters Jr. received a bachelor's degree in 1964 from the University of Oklahoma and a master's degree from Oklahoma State University. Dr. Peters later received his doctorate from Oklahoma State University; and

WHEREAS, Roy Peters served as Superintendent of the Canadian Valley Area Vocational-Technical School and Assistant Superintendent of the Moore-Norman Area Vocational-Technical School; and

WHEREAS, Roy Peters joined the Oklahoma Department of Vocational and Technical Education in July 1984, as Associate Director, where he supervised the area vocational-technical school system and the business and industry training program within the department. He was named Director upon the retirement of Dr. Francis Tuttle in 1986; and

WHEREAS, during Roy Peters' tenure as State Director, enrollment in the vo-tech system rose from 240,733 in 1986 to 459,684 in January 1999. The number of area vo-tech school districts increased from twenty-four to twenty-nine and campuses increased from forty-one to fifty-four; and

WHEREAS, Roy Peters Jr. was recognized by the American Vocational Association, which named him the Outstanding Vocational Educator of the Year at the 1995 American Vocational Association Convention in Denver, Colorado. The Oklahoma State Legislature honored this accomplishment in Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 43 passed by the 2nd Session of the 45th Oklahoma Legislature; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Roy Peters Jr. testified as an expert witness before the United States Senate Labor and Human Resources Committee, Subcommittee on Education, Arts and Humanities on the topic of developing the nation's workforce. Dr. Peters was selected as a United States representative to an international conference on workforce preparation held in the Netherlands; and

WHEREAS, Roy Peters is leaving the Oklahoma Department of Vocational and Technical Education after fourteen dedicated years of forward-looking service and devotion to vocational education in the State of Oklahoma.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 47TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature proclaims April 20, 1999, as "Roy Peters Day" in the State of Oklahoma.

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature thanks Dr. Roy Peters Jr. for his many years of public service to vocational education.

THAT a copy of this resolution be distributed to Dr. Roy Peters Jr.
