A Concurrent Resolution honoring Bishop Frederick
Hilborn Talbot; congratulating him for his service to
the 12th Episcopal District; and directing
distribution.

WHEREAS, Frederick Hilborn Talbot was elected the 90th Bishop of the African Methodist Episcopal Church in 1972. He currently serves as Bishop and Chief Pastor of the 12th Episcopal District, with headquarters in North Little Rock, Arkansas, having jurisdiction over the Arkansas and Oklahoma areas. Bishop Talbot will conclude his duties as Bishop of the 12th Episcopal District in July of this year; and

WHEREAS, Frederick Hilborn Talbot graduated from Allen University, Yale Divinity School, the Pacific School of Religion, and Columbia Theological Seminary. He also served as a Resident Fellow at Harvard University; and

WHEREAS, Frederick Hilborn Talbot served in the Diplomatic Service of the Government of Guyana as former Ambassador to the United Nations; and

WHEREAS, Bishop Frederick H. Talbot has authored the book "African American Worship" which was published by Fairway Press. The volume was met with critical acclaim. He also authored "New Eyes For Seeing" regarding the revitalization of Christian worship in Georgia. Bishop Talbot co-authored "The Wanted Child" a study of family planning in the Caribbean and "Guiana Sings" a book of folk songs; and

WHEREAS, Bishop Frederick Hilborn Talbot was instrumental in the relief effort to aid those affected by the tornado that struck near Birmingham, Alabama, in April 1998. Donations from Arkansas included new clothing, food, paper goods and other items essential for recovery from the twister; and

WHEREAS, Bishop Frederick Hilborn Talbot, composer, poet, educator, author, humanitarian and church leader will soon be concluding his tenure with the 12th Episcopal District of the African Methodist Episcopal Church.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 47TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature honors Bishop Frederick Hilborn Talbot for his demonstrated leadership and scholarship in the African American religious community.

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature congratulates Bishop Frederick Hilborn Talbot for his service to the State of Oklahoma.
