House Bill No. 1500

HOUSE BILL NO. 1500 -- By COX and VAUGHN.

An Act relating to crimes and punishments; enacting the Identity Theft Act of 1999; prohibiting identity theft; providing for codification; providing for noncodification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

Section 2 of this act shall be known as the "Identity Theft Act of 1999".

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1532.1 of Title 21, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Any person who knowingly uses the name, date of birth or social security number of another person, without the consent of that other person, with the intent to obtain or use the identity of the other person for any unlawful purpose or to cause loss to a person shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a felony.

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 1999.
