House Bill No. 1723

ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1723 - By: Miller of the House and Helton of the Senate.

An Act relating to the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Act; amending 63 O.S. 1991, Section 2-103, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 387, O.S.L. 1998 (63 O.S. Supp. 1998, Section 2-103), which relates to Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control agents; modifying circumstances for award of sidearm and badge; requiring peace officers to provide notice to Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control upon seizure of certain chemicals; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 1991, Section 2-103, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 387, O.S.L. 1998 (63 O.S. Supp. 1998, Section 2-103), is amended to read as follows:

Section 2-103. A. The Director shall be appointed by the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control Commission. The Director of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control on January 1, 1984, shall be initially appointed as Director. The succeeding Director shall, at the time of his appointment, have a Bachelor's Degree from an accredited college or university and at least five (5) years' experience in drug law enforcement. The Director may appoint necessary assistants, agents, and other

1 personnel to perform the work of the office and may prescribe their
2 titles and duties and fix their compensation pursuant to Merit
3 System rules. The Director may appoint an employee to the position
4 of Public Information/Education Officer. Said position shall be
5 unclassified and exempt from the rules and procedures of the Office
6 of Personnel Management, except leave regulations. The office of
7 the Director shall be located at a suitable place in Oklahoma City,
8 Oklahoma.

9 B. 1. Agents appointed by the Director shall have the powers
10 of peace officers generally; provided, the Director may appoint
11 special agents to meet specific investigatory need, who do not meet
12 the age and educational requirements as specified in this section.

13 2. On and after July 1, 1998, agents shall be at least twenty-
14 one (21) years of age and shall have a Bachelor's Degree from an
15 accredited college or university.

16 3. Each entering agent shall be required to serve one (1) year
17 in a probationary status as a prerequisite to being placed on
18 permanent status.

19 C. Agents appointed pursuant to the provisions of this section
20 shall have the responsibility of investigating alleged violations
21 and shall have the authority to arrest those suspected of having
22 violated the provisions of the Uniform Controlled Dangerous
23 Substances Act.

1 D. A commissioned employee of the Oklahoma State Bureau of
2 Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control shall be entitled to receive
3 upon retirement by reason of length of service, the continued
4 custody and possession of the sidearm and badge carried by such
5 employee immediately prior to retirement.

6 E. A commissioned employee of the Bureau may be entitled to
7 receive, upon retirement by reason of disability, the continued
8 custody and possession of the sidearm and badge carried by such
9 employee immediately prior to retirement upon written approval of
10 the Director.

11 F. Custody and possession of the sidearm and badge of a
12 commissioned employee killed in the line of duty may be awarded by
13 the Director to the spouse or next of kin of the deceased employee.

14 G. Custody and possession of the sidearm and badge of a
15 commissioned employee who dies while employed at the Oklahoma State
16 Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control may be awarded by
17 the Director to the spouse or next of kin of the deceased employee.

18 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-330 of Title 63, unless there
20 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

21 It shall be the duty of any peace officer of the State of
22 Oklahoma who seizes any glassware, instruments, devices, utensils or
23 precursor chemicals, as defined by Section 2-322 of Title 63 of the

1 Oklahoma Statutes, which have been used or were intended to be used
2 in the illicit manufacturing of any controlled dangerous substance,
3 in full or in part, to make notice of the seizure in writing to the
4 Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control.

5 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 1999.

6 SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
7 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
8 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
9 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
