ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 2310 - By: PERRY of the House and ROBINSON of the Senate.

[**electronic commerce - Task Force on electronic commerce - emergency**]

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 3, Chapter 195, O.S.L.

1999, is amended to read as follows:

A. There is hereby created to continue until June 1, ~~2000~~ 2003, the Task Force on Electronic Commerce. The purpose of the Task Force shall be to study the technology of and applications for electronic commerce and to prepare recommendations for legislative and other action needed to assure the availability and use of electronic commerce technology in the state.

B. The Task Force shall be composed of ~~thirty-eight (38)~~ **thirty-nine (39)** members as follows:

1. The Secretary of State or designee;
2. The Director of State Finance or designee;
3. The Director of the Information Services Division of the Office of State Finance or designee;

- 1 4. The Attorney General or designee;
- 2 5. The Director of the Department of Central Services or
- 3 designee;
- 4 6. The Director of the Oklahoma Department of Commerce or
- 5 designee;
- 6 7. The Chancellor of the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
- 7 Education;
- 8 8. The Chief Justice of the Oklahoma Supreme Court or designee;
- 9 9. The Chair of the Evidence Code Committee for the Oklahoma
- 10 Bar Association;
- 11 10. Two members of the House of Representatives appointed by
- 12 the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
- 13 11. One member who represents a statewide association of
- 14 professional engineers and architects to be appointed by the Speaker
- 15 of the House of Representatives;
- 16 12. The Chair of the House of Representatives Banking
- 17 Committee;
- 18 13. The Chair of the Senate Finance Committee;
- 19 14. The Chair of the House of Representatives Judiciary
- 20 Committee;
- 21 15. The Chair of the Senate Judiciary Committee;
- 22 16. Two members of the Senate appointed by the President Pro
- 23 Tempore of the Senate;

- 1 17. Two members who represent a business association to be
2 appointed by the Governor;
- 3 18. Two members who represent the banking industry to be
4 appointed by the Governor;
- 5 19. One member who represents a state banking association to be
6 appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate;
- 7 20. Two members who represent the insurance industry to be
8 appointed by the Governor;
- 9 21. Two members of the Oklahoma Bar Association to be appointed
10 by the Governor;
- 11 22. One member who represents large manufacturing businesses to
12 be appointed by the Governor;
- 13 23. One member who represents small manufacturing businesses to
14 be appointed by the Governor;
- 15 24. One member from a software or computer services business
16 entity to be appointed by the Governor;
- 17 25. One member who represents the land title profession to be
18 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
- 19 26. Two members who represent the telecommunications industry,
20 one to be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and
21 one to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

1 27. One member who represents a federal governmental agency
2 with offices in Oklahoma to be appointed by the President Pro
3 Tempore of the Senate;

4 **28. One member who represents credit unions, appointed by the**
5 **President Pro Tempore of the Senate;**

6 ~~28~~ **29.** Two members who represent vocational-technical
7 education, one to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
8 Representatives and one to be appointed by the Governor; and

9 ~~29~~ **30.** Two members at large, one to be appointed by the Speaker
10 of the House of Representatives and one to be appointed by the
11 President Pro Tempore of the Senate.

12 C. Members who were serving on the Task Force on Electronic
13 Signature Technology as of February 1, 1999, shall automatically be
14 appointed to serve on the Task Force on Electronic Commerce upon the
15 effective date of this act.

16 D. Meetings shall be held at the call of the chairperson. The
17 Task Force shall meet at such time as established by the
18 chairperson.

19 E. The Task Force shall:

20 1. Study the technology of and applications for electronic
21 commerce;

22 2. Review and compare electronic commerce legislation from
23 other states;

1 3. Survey vendors which have developed technology for
2 electronic commerce and review the available technology;

3 4. Study the cost of implementing and maintaining a state
4 electronic signature certification program;

5 5. Make recommendations on an appropriate structure for a state
6 electronic signature certification program; and

7 6. Make recommendations for implementing electronic commerce
8 procedures for state agencies.

9 F. On or before January 1, ~~2000~~ 2003, the Task Force shall
10 issue a final report of findings and recommendations to the
11 Governor, the Legislature, each member of the Governor's Cabinet and
12 appropriate state agencies. The Task Force shall continue to meet
13 until June 1, ~~2000~~ 2003, to continue to carry out the duties of the
14 Task Force and make recommendations concerning any possible
15 legislative action.

16 G. Members of the Task Force shall receive no compensation for
17 serving on the Task Force, but shall receive travel reimbursement as
18 follows:

19 1. Legislative members of the Task Force shall be reimbursed
20 for their necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of
21 their duties in accordance with Section 456 of Title 74 of the
22 Oklahoma Statutes from the legislative body in which they serve;

1 2. State agency employees who are members of the Task Force
2 shall be reimbursed for travel expenses incurred in the performance
3 of their duties by their respective agencies in accordance with the
4 State Travel Reimbursement Act; and

5 3. All other Task Force members shall be reimbursed by the
6 Oklahoma Department of Commerce for travel expenses incurred in
7 performance of their duties on the Task Force, in accordance with
8 the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

9 H. As necessary to carry out its charge, the Task Force may
10 seek technical assistance from specialists in electronic commerce
11 technology.

12 I. Staffing for the Task Force shall be provided jointly by the
13 Office of the Secretary of State and the Oklahoma Department of
14 Commerce.

15 SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
16 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
17 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
18 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
