COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 860 - By: ROZELL of the Senate and ADAIR of the House.

[solid waste - prohibiting the Department of Environmental Quality from issuing site permit in certain areas - emergency]

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 1991, Section 1-2414, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 401, O.S.L. 1998, and as renumbered by Section 359, Chapter 145, O.S.L. 1993 (27A O.S. Supp. 1999, Section 2-10-301), is amended to read as follows:

Section 2-10-301. A. Except as otherwise specified in this section:

1. No person shall dispose of solid waste at any site or facility other than a site or facility for which a permit for solid or hazardous waste disposal has been issued by the Department of Environmental Quality;

2. No person shall own or operate a site or facility at which solid waste is disposed other than a site or facility for which a permit for solid or hazardous waste disposal has been issued by the Department;

1 3. No person shall knowingly transport solid waste to an
2 unpermitted site or facility; and

3 4. The Department shall not bring an enforcement action against
4 any unit of local government which undertakes any remediation of an
5 illegal dump which the local government had no role in creating
6 provided that the unit of local government first consults with and
7 follows the remediation advice of the Department. The Department is
8 authorized to recommend remediation of illegal dumps by burial of
9 the material on location, when such burial appears to pose less risk
10 than failure to remediate.

11 B. No provision of the Oklahoma Solid Waste Management Act
12 shall be construed to prevent a person from disposing of solid waste
13 from his or her household upon his or her property provided such
14 disposal does not create a nuisance or a hazard to the public health
15 or environment or does not violate a local government ordinance.

16 C. Notice of permit actions shall be in accordance with the
17 Uniform Permitting Act.

18 D. The Department shall issue a permit to be effective for the
19 life of a given site. In order to assure adequate financial
20 assurance as required by this section, each permittee who operates a
21 landfill disposal site, other than a generator owned and operated
22 private industrial nonhazardous monofill, shall submit information
23 on an annual basis at such times and in such form as the Department

1 shall require, sufficient to allow the Department to know the
2 remaining landfill life.

3 E. Information and data submitted in support of a permit
4 application or a permit modification application for any site
5 serving a population equivalent of five thousand (5,000) or more
6 persons shall be prepared and sealed by a professional engineer
7 licensed to practice in this state. Applicants for smaller site
8 permits are encouraged but not required to seek professional
9 engineering assistance.

10 F. The Department shall not issue any permit for the siting or
11 expansion of an asbestos monofill which will be located closer than
12 five hundred (500) yards from any occupied residence. No asbestos
13 monofill shall be constructed within three (3) miles of the
14 corporate boundaries of any city or town.

15 G. Disposal sites approved by the Department to receive only
16 solid waste shall not accept for disposal any waste classified as
17 hazardous waste.

18 H. No permit shall be required for a disposal site constructed
19 pursuant to an order issued by the Department in an effort to
20 remediate an abandoned or inactive waste site. Such disposal site
21 shall only receive waste from the remediation project, and shall be
22 designed, constructed, and operated in accordance with the technical
23 standards established in the applicable rules promulgated by the

1 Environmental Quality Board. Such rules shall not be less stringent
2 than those which would apply to a federally funded remediation
3 project pursuant to the federal Comprehensive Environmental
4 Response, Compensation and Liability Act.

5 I. The Department shall not issue any permit for the new siting
6 or expansion of a municipal solid waste landfill located in or over
7 a locally fractured or cavernous limestone or cherty limestone
8 bedrock which is in or over an aquifer classified as high or very
9 high in vulnerability level as determined by the Oklahoma Water
10 Resources Board.

11 SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
12 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
13 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
14 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
