

An Act relating to criminal procedure; amending Section 51, Chapter 133, O.S.L. 1997, as amended by Section 13, Chapter 333, O.S.L. 1997 (22 O.S. Supp. 1998, Section 987.13), which relates to the local administrator for the Oklahoma Community Sentencing Act; prohibiting collection and disbursement of certain payments; amending Section 64, Chapter 133, O.S.L. 1997 (22 O.S. Supp. 1998, Section 990), which relates to suspended, split and delayed sentences; clarifying conditions of certain sentence; changing limitations on suspended sentence; providing certain extension of supervision by court order; deleting requirement to forward certain payments; prohibiting collection or disbursement of certain payments by certain persons; amending 22 O.S. 1991, Section 991a, as last amended by Section 65, Chapter 133, O.S.L. 1997 (22 O.S. Supp. 1998, Section 991a), which relates to the powers of the court; including requirement for victim compensation assessment; requiring restitution; clarifying language; requiring consideration of victim impact statement prior to sentencing; amending 22 O.S. 1991, Section 991d, as last amended by Section 3, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 1996 (22 O.S. Supp. 1998, Section 991d), which relates to supervision fee; prohibiting the Department of Corrections from collecting or disbursing restitution and other fines and payments; deleting authority for certain user fee; amending 22 O.S. 1991, Section 991f, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 410, O.S.L. 1998 (22 O.S. Supp. 1998, Section 991f), which relates to restitution; expanding certain definition; making policy statement; providing certain interest on court-ordered restitution; including the state in priority for payments; modifying language; construing ability to proceed with restitution without certain form; providing assistance from certain office; authorizing referral of restitution for negotiation to certain office; authorizing certain office to file petition for modification of court-ordered restitution; authorizing alternative assistance to reducing court-ordered restitution to judgment; requiring consent of victim before converting restitution payments to community service hours; providing for reinstatement of restitution under certain condition; stating duties of the Restitution Office of the Courts; and declaring an emergency.
