AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to crimes and punishments;
prohibiting removal of pipeline markers; providing
penalty; providing for codification; and providing an
effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1786.1 of Title 21, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Any person who defaces, steals or removes any sign or marker
posted for the purpose of identifying the location of a pipeline
used for conducting oil, gas or gasoline shall be deemed guilty of a
misdemeanor and upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine of not
more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), a term of imprisonment
in the county jail not to exceed one (1) year, or by both such fine
and imprisonment.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 1999.
