HOUSE JOINT
RESOLUTION HJR1057

AS INTRODUCED

A Joint Resolution relating to proposed rules of the Board of Dentistry of Oklahoma; disapproving proposed amendments to permanent rules OAC 195:20-1-2, OAC 195:20-1-4(d), OAC 195:20-1-5(d) and OAC 195:20-1-14(b), regarding administration of anesthesia; providing for distribution; and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 250.2 and 308 of Title 75 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the Legislature reserves the right to designate the method for rule promulgation, establish policy, determine that a rule is not consistent with legislative intent and disapprove any rule or any portion thereof at any time; and

WHEREAS, on February 25, 2000, the Board of Dentistry adopted proposed amendments to permanent rules regarding administration of anesthesia, relating to definitions, conscious sedation utilizing parenteral methods, general anesthesia (to include deep sedation), facility permit inspections and the Anesthesia Advisory Committee, and on March 2, 2000, the agency submitted the rule to the Legislature for review; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that the proposed amendments to permanent rules are not consistent with legislative intent, and violate public policy.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 47TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

SECTION 1. The Legislature hereby disapproves the following proposed deletion of language from permanent rule OAC 195-20-1-2:

"Dentist Anesthesiologist" means a licensed dentist who has successfully completed a minimum of two years postgraduate training in anesthesiology from an accredited institution.

SECTION 2. The Legislature hereby disapproves the proposed amendments to permanent rules OAC 195:20-1-4(d), OAC 195:20-1-5(d) and OAC 195:20-1-14(b).

SECTION 3. The Secretary of State is hereby directed to distribute copies of this resolution to the Governor, the members of the Board of Dentistry and the Editor of "The Oklahoma Register".

SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this resolution shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
