HOUSE CONCURRENT  
RESOLUTION NO. 1002

AS INTRODUCED

A Concurrent Resolution authorizing study by certain agencies of issues related to commercial driver licenses; providing for report; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Legislature recognizes that a person who is required to have a commercial driver license for purposes of employment may be subject to loss of employment due to traffic citations issued not during the course of employment; and

WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Legislature further recognizes that a person may receive traffic citations for driving during the course of employment that will affect affordability of insurance for a personal vehicle not used during the course of the employment of that person.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 47TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Oklahoma Department of Public Safety, the Oklahoma Department of Transportation and the Oklahoma Insurance Department shall conduct a study regarding how to assure that traffic citations only affect driving records and insurance costs for the type of vehicle being driven at the time of the citation.

THAT the previously listed agencies shall submit a report of the findings of their study to the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Governor by January 1, 2000.

THAT a copy of this resolution be distributed to the Department of Public Safety, the Oklahoma Department of Transportation and the Oklahoma Insurance Department.
