AS INTRODUCED

A Concurrent Resolution congratulating Faren Lee Revard, Miss Indian Oklahoma; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, Faren Lee Revard, a member of the Osage and Kaw Tribes, is a 1994 graduate of Pawhuska High School and is scheduled to graduate from Oklahoma State University in the summer of 1999 with a double major in Agricultural Economics and Agricultural Communications; and

WHEREAS, Faren Lee Revard has been involved in a variety of activities and projects and has been a member of several organizations while at Oklahoma State University including participating in the Multicultural Leadership Development Project, being a member of the Collegiate CattleWomen and the American Indian Science and Engineering Society, treasurer for the Native American Student Association and involved in the President's Leadership Council and the Freshmen Representative Council; and

WHEREAS, Faren Lee Revard has been involved in several internships including internships with the National Institute for Petroleum and Energy Research in Bartlesville, Oklahoma, on a Native American Initiative Project, the Tribal Resource in Business, Engineering and Science summer experience in Albuquerque, New Mexico, and the Bureau of Land Management's (BLM) state office in

Santa Fe, New Mexico, and her current internship with the BLM's Wild Horse and Burro Program in Moore, Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, Faren Lee Revard represented Oklahoma State University as the Native American Student Association's 1996-97 Princess and was chosen as Standing Bear Princess in September of 1998; and

WHEREAS, Faren Lee Revard was crowned the 1999 Miss Indian Oklahoma and will spend the year traveling and representing herself, the State of Oklahoma, the Oklahoma Federation of Indian Women and the Osage Tribe as an "Ambassador of Goodwill"; and

WHEREAS, Faren Lee Revard is an exceptional woman who will represent her state well during her reign as Miss Indian Oklahoma.
