AS INTRODUCED

A Concurrent Resolution commending Company F, 43rd Engineer Regiment for distinguished service during World War II; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, Company F, 43rd Engineer Regiment has a record of valiant service during World War II that is in keeping with the honorable traditions of United States military service; and

WHEREAS, the 43rd Engineer Regiment, which was formed at Camp Joseph T. Robinson, Arkansas in March 1941, greatly added to the war effort by constructing seaports and airports in Australia, New Guinea, the Philippines and other sites in the Pacific; and

WHEREAS, the distinguished achievements of the Regiment in the Southwest Pacific immeasurably enhanced the ability of the Allied Forces to defeat Japanese forces; and

WHEREAS, it is an honor to recognize the achievements of Company F, 43rd Engineer Regiment and their service to the world in time of war.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 47TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:
