AS INTRODUCED

A Concurrent Resolution declaring Friday, May 21, 1999, as Thomas P. Stafford Day; commending Thomas P. Stafford for his contributions to the United States Space Program on the 30th anniversary of the Apollo 10 mission; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, Thomas P. Stafford, Commander of Apollo 10, May 18th through May 25th, 1969, completed his mission to orbit the Moon; and

WHEREAS, Thomas P. Stafford "blazed the trail" for the first Moon landing; and

WHEREAS, Thomas P. Stafford flew to within ten miles of the surface of the Moon; and

WHEREAS, Thomas P. Stafford is one of only twenty-four men to orbit the Moon; and

WHEREAS, on this thirtieth anniversary of Apollo 10, Thomas P. Stafford is recognized for his contribution as a Space Pioneer and favorite son of Oklahoma.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 47TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT Friday, May 21, 1999, be declared Thomas P. Stafford Day.

THAT Thomas P. Stafford be commended for his contribution to the United States Space Program on the 30th anniversary of the Apollo 10 mission around the Moon.

THAT a copy of this resolution be distributed to Thomas P. Stafford, a favorite son of Oklahoma.
