SENATE BILL 1215

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to cities and towns; defining terms; allowing municipal governing bodies to determine use of photo-monitoring systems for use with traffic-control devices; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 22-117.2 of Title 11, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. For purposes of this section:

1. "Photo-monitoring system" means a vehicle sensor installed to work in conjunction with a traffic-control device which automatically produces one or more photographs, one or more microphotographs, a videotape or other recorded images of each vehicle at the time it is used or operated in violation of the law by running a red light; and

2. "Vehicle" means every motorized device in, upon or by which a person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a highway, except devices used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks.

B. The municipal governing body may determine and declare it reasonable that a photo-monitoring system may be used in conjunction with traffic-control devices to record the license plate of vehicles running red lights.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2000.
