

Twelfth Legislative Day

Thursday, February 24, 2000

Representative Pope (Tim) moved to amend **HB 2037**, Page 2, Lines 6-8 and 17-19, Page 3, Lines 2-4, 13-15 and 20-22 and Page 4, Lines 9-11 and 17-19 by deleting the language: “or by imprisonment in a county jail not exceeding one (1) year or by a fine of not less than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) nor more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00)” and inserting in lieu thereof the language: “or by imprisonment in a county jail not less than five (5) years or by a fine of not less than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00)”, which amendment was declared adopted.
