HB 2728 by Benson of the House and Taylor of the Senate was read and considered.

Coauthored by Representative(s) Askins, Beutler, Wells, Matlock

Speaker Benson moved to amend **HB 2728**, Page 4, Section 1, Lines 12-14 by deleting the language: "the 3rd year of agriculture science education when taken in the eleventh or twelfth grade, the 4th year of agriculture science education when taken in the eleventh or twelfth grade" and inserting in lieu thereof the language: "qualified agricultural education courses"; and Page 6, Line 4 ½ by adding a new paragraph 5 to read as follows:

"5. 'Qualified agricultural education courses' means courses that have been determined by the State Board of Education to offer the sets of competencies in the Priority Academic Student Skills (PASS) for one or more science content areas and which correspond to academic science courses. Qualified agricultural education courses shall include, but are not limited to, Horticulture, Plant and Soil Science, Natural Resources and Environmental Science, and Animal Science. The courses shall be taught by teachers certified in agricultural education and comply with all rules of the Oklahoma Department of Vocational and Technical Education."

which amendment was declared adopted.

Speaker Benson moved to amend **HB 2728**, Page 5, Section 1, Line 12 by adding after the period "." the following language: "School districts shall strongly encourage students to complete two units or sets of competencies of foreign languages as part of the core curriculum for high school graduation.", which amendment was declared adopted.

Speaker Benson moved to amend **HB 2728**, Page 13, Line 9 by adding new Sections 6 and 7 to read as follows and renumbering subsequent sections, which amendment was declared adopted:

"SECTION 6. AMENDATORY Section 7, Chapter 320, O.S.L. 1999 (70 O.S. Supp. 1999, Section 3-132), is amended to read as follows:

"A. The Oklahoma Charter Schools Act shall apply only to charter schools formed and operated under the provisions of the act. Charter schools shall ~~only~~ be sponsored ~~by~~ only as follows:

1. By a local school district ~~or an area vocational-technical school district in districts~~ with an average daily membership of five thousand (5,000) or more and which all or part of the school district is located in a county having more than five hundred thousand (500,000) population according to the latest federal Decennial Census; ~~or~~

2. By an area vocational-technical school district only when the charter school is located in a local school district served by the area vocational-technical school district and only if the local school district has an average daily membership of five thousand (5,000) or more and which all or part of the local school district is located in a county having more than five hundred thousand (500,000) population according to the latest federal Decennial Census.

Additional charter schools may be sponsored as provided for in Section ~~§ 3-133~~ of this ~~act~~ title.

Charter schools formed pursuant to the act shall serve as a pilot program to demonstrate the potential of expanding charter schools to other parts of the state. Any charter or enterprise school operating in the state pursuant to an agreement with the board of education of a school district on July 1, 1999, may continue to operate pursuant to that agreement or may contract with the board of education of the school district pursuant to the Oklahoma Charter Schools Act. Nothing in the Oklahoma Charter Schools Act shall prohibit a school district from applying for exemptions from certain education-related statutory requirements as provided for in the Education Deregulation Act.

B. For purposes of the Oklahoma Charter Schools Act, "charter school" means a public school established by contract with a board of education of a school district or an area vocational-technical school district pursuant to the Oklahoma Charter Schools Act to provide learning that will improve student achievement and as defined in the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, 20 U.S.C. 8065.

C. A charter school may consist of a new school site, new school sites or all or any portion of an existing school site. An entire school district may not become a charter school site.

SECTION 7. AMENDATORY Section 8, Chapter 320, O.S.L. 1999 (70 O.S. Supp. 1999, Section 3-133), is amended to read as follows:

In addition to charter schools sponsored as provided for in subsection A of Section ~~7~~ 3-132 of this ~~act~~ title, charter schools shall ~~only~~ be sponsored ~~by~~ only as follows:

1. By a local school district ~~or an area vocational-technical school district in districts~~ with an average daily membership of five thousand (5,000) or more and which all or part of the school district is located in a county which is contiguous with a county having more than five hundred thousand (500,000) population according the latest federal Decennial Census; ~~or~~

2. By an area vocational-technical school district only when the charter school is located in a local school district served by the area vocational-technical school district and only if the local school district has an average daily membership of five thousand (5,000) or more and which all or part of the local school district is located in a county which is contiguous with a county having more than five hundred thousand (500,000) population according to the latest federal Decennial Census.

~~; provided, no~~ No charter school shall be chartered in School District I029 in County No. 14 and School District I027 in County No. 9."

Supp. 1999, Section 583), which relates to used motor vehicle dealer licenses; providing different security requirements for non-auction consignment dealers; providing different means of determining when business is primarily consignment business; authorizing promulgation of rules and sanctions for violation of rules; and providing an effective date.

Supp. 1999, Section 121), which relates to fees for printing legal notices; clarifying language; requiring county treasurer to distribute funds collected for cost of publications; and providing an effective date.

SB 1392 – Ford of the Senate and Adkins of the House.

[schools - certain certification for teachers of certain courses – codification - effective date - emergency]

SB 1551 – Weedn of the Senate and Kirby of the House.

An Act relating to blind persons; amending 7 O.S. 1991, Section 73, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 89, O.S.L. 1997 (7 O.S. Supp. 1999, Section 73), which relates to operation of vending facilities on state or county property; expanding list of entities required to give priority to specified vending facilities; prohibiting charging of commission on sales; and providing an effective date.

SB 1577 – Cain of the Senate and Blackburn of the House.

An Act relating to children; amending 10 O.S. 1991, Section 1107, as last amended by Section 10, Chapter 352, O.S.L. 1995, and as renumbered by Section 199, Chapter 352, O.S.L. 1995 (10 O.S. Supp. 1999, Section 7003-2.1), which relates to protective custody; expanding conditions under which a child may be taken into protective custody prior to filing of petition; providing for nonprosecution of certain parent for specified crimes;

requiring certain entities to accept or take possession of a child and to provide for the physical health or safety of the child; defining term; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1597 – Fisher, Williams, Dunlap and Williamson of the Senate and Boyd and Thornbrugh of the House.

[schools - Oklahoma Partnership for School Readiness Act – codification - effective date – emergency]
