“66. The Oklahoma Tax Commission shall design appropriate official license plate for vehicles of the Oklahoma B.P.O.E. ‘The Elks’. Oklahoma B.P.O.E. License plates - such plates shall be designed and issued to any B.P.O.E. member. The license shall have the legend ‘Oklahoma’ and shall contain in the center the Elks emblem. The fee for each plate shall be Five Dollars (\$5.00) and shall be in addition to all other registration fees required by the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration Act.”,

“SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 1991, Section 1140.1, is amended to read as follows:

~~Section 1140.1 A. Except as otherwise provided in this section, each motor license agent appointed after July 1, 1988, within a specific municipality shall be furnished a camera by the Department of Public Safety without charge if, based upon the number of driver's licenses issued during the preceding year, the total number of licenses issued shall average not less than one thousand two hundred (1,200) per year per camera within the municipality and not less than one thousand two hundred (1,200) per year per camera within the county; provided, each county shall have at least one motor license agent who shall be furnished a camera without charge.~~

~~B. Any motor license agent who has been furnished a camera without charge prior to July 1, 1988, shall continue to have such camera furnished without charge until a new motor license agent is appointed.~~

~~C. A Any motor license agent appointed after July 1, 1988, who is not entitled to be furnished a camera pursuant to the provisions of subsection A of this section may be furnished a camera upon signing an agreement with the Department of Public Safety to process a minimum of one thousand two hundred (1,200) licenses per year or to pay the~~

~~Department the sum of fifty cents (\$0.50) for each license under one thousand two hundred (1,200) issued per year. For agreements entered into prior to the effective date of this act under which the payment was calculated based upon the difference between the number of licenses issued and three thousand (3,000), the payment shall be recalculated based upon the difference between the number of licenses issued and one thousand two hundred (1,200). The amount of the difference between the recalculated payment and any payment actually made by a motor license agent prior to the effective date of this act shall be refunded to the motor license agent.~~

~~D. For the purposes of this section, each motor license agent appointed after July 1, 1988, shall be considered a new agent, whether assets of another agency were inherited, purchased or otherwise acquired.~~

~~E. The furnishing of any camera shall be subject to availability from the vendor and, if limited, shall be allocated by priority according to subsections A, B and C of this section, in that order or may lease or purchase a camera from a private vendor."~~

Representative Covey moved to amend **HB 2311**, Page 8, Line 16 1/2 by inserting a new Section 4 to read as follows and renumbering subsequent section:

"SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1132.4 of Title 47, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. There is levied and there shall be paid to the Oklahoma Tax Commission a fee of One Dollar (\$1.00) upon every vehicle to be registered or licensed in the State of Oklahoma. Said fee shall accrue and shall be collectible upon each vehicle under the same circumstances and shall be payable in the same manner and times as apply to vehicle licenses and registrations under the provisions of the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration Act; provided, said fee shall be paid in full for the then current year at the time any vehicle is first registered in a calendar year.

B. 1. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and for each fiscal year thereafter, the sum of fifty cents (\$0.50) shall be transferred by the Tax Commission to the State Treasurer for deposit in the General Revenue Fund.

2. Of the remaining fifty cents (\$0.50), for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and for each fiscal year thereafter, the first Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) of the monies collected pursuant to this paragraph each fiscal year shall be transferred by the Tax Commission to the State Treasurer to be deposited in the Department of Public Safety Patrol Vehicle Revolving Fund, for the purpose of purchasing patrol vehicles. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and for each fiscal year thereafter, any amount collected pursuant to this paragraph in excess of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) shall be transferred by the Tax Commission to the State Treasurer to be deposited into the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Retirement Fund.

C. The collection and payment of said fee shall be a prerequisite to license or registration of any vehicle."

An Act directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to Section 3 of Article XXVIII of the Oklahoma Constitution; allowing Oklahoma winemakers to make direct sales to retail package stores and restaurants in this state; defining term; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law, the following proposed amendment to Section 3 of Article XXVIII of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma, to read as follows:

Section 3. The Legislature shall enact laws providing for the strict regulation, control, licensing, and taxation of the manufacture, sale, distribution, possession, and transportation of alcoholic beverages, consistent with the provisions of this Amendment. Provided, that any manufacturer, or subsidiary of any manufacturer who markets his product solely through a subsidiary or subsidiaries, a distiller, rectifier, bottler, winemaker, brewer, or importer of alcoholic beverages, bottled or made in a foreign country, either within or without this state, shall be required to sell such brands or kinds of alcoholic beverages to every licensed wholesale distributor who desires to purchase the same, on the same price basis and without discrimination, and shall further be required to sell such beverages only to those distributors licensed as wholesale distributors. Winemakers either within or without this state shall be required to sell wine they produce to every licensed wholesale distributor who desires to purchase the wine, but winemakers shall not be required to sell the wine they produce only to licensed wholesale distributors. Winemakers may sell wine produced at the winery to consumers on the premises of the winery. Oklahoma winemakers may sell and ship the wine they produce at wineries in this state directly to retail package stores and restaurants in this state. As used in this section, "restaurant" means an establishment that is licensed to sell alcoholic beverages by the individual drink for on-premises consumption and where food is prepared and sold for immediate consumption on the premises. All laws passed by the Legislature under the authority of the Article shall be consistent with this provision.

SECTION 2. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this act shall be in the following form:

THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:

This measure amends the State Constitution. It amends Section 3 of Article 28. Presently, wineries may sell their wine to consumers at the winery. They also may sell wine to wholesalers. They cannot sell wine to retail package stores. They cannot sell wine to restaurants. This act would allow Oklahoma wineries to sell their wine to retail package stores and restaurants in this state. They also could ship the wine directly to the retail package stores and restaurants.

Section 8C. A. Despite any provision to the contrary, beginning January 1, ~~1997~~ 2001, the fair cash value, as determined by law, on each homestead of an individual head of household whose gross household income from all sources for the preceding calendar year did not exceed ~~Twenty five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00)~~ the amount as set forth in subsection B of this section, and which individual head of household is sixty-five (65) years of age or older, shall not exceed the fair cash value placed upon the property during the first year in which the individual head of household was sixty-five (65) years of age or older and had gross household income from all sources of ~~Twenty five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00)~~ in the amount as set forth in subsection B of this section or less. Subject to the limitations of this section, the fair cash value shall not exceed such amount as long as the individual head of household who is sixty-five (65) years of age or older owns and occupies the property and as long as the gross household income from all sources does not exceed ~~Twenty five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00)~~ the amount as set forth in subsection B of this section in any calendar year. If any improvements are made to the property, the fair cash value of the improvements shall be assessed in accordance with law by the county assessor and added to the assessed value of the property. Once the fair cash value of the improvements has been added to the fair cash value of the property, the total fair cash value shall not exceed the revised valuation of the property so long as the individual head of household who is sixty-five (65) years of age or older owns and occupies the property and so long as the gross household income from all sources does not exceed ~~Twenty five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00)~~ the amount as set forth in subsection B of this section in a calendar year. For any individual head of household who is sixty-five (65) years of age or older prior to January 1, 1997, and has gross household income from all sources of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) or less in calendar year 1996, the fair cash value of the real property shall be the fair cash value placed upon the property on January 1, 1997. If the individual head of household ceases to own and occupy the property or if the gross household income from all sources exceeds ~~Twenty five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00)~~ the amount as set forth in subsection B of this section in a calendar year, the fair cash value of the property shall be determined as if the provisions of Section 8 of Article X of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma or any other provisions relating to a limitation on the fair cash value of locally assessed real property had been in effect during the time the property was valued pursuant to the provisions of this section.

B. Beginning January 1, 2001, gross household income from all sources as used in subsection A of this section shall be Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00). Beginning January 1, 2002, the gross household income from all sources of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) shall be annually adjusted to reflect inflationary changes pursuant to the Consumer Price Index as determined by the United States Department of Labor. The annual adjustment shall be confirmed by the State Board of Equalization in accordance with this subsection during the annual meeting of the State Board of Equalization as set forth in paragraph 1 of Section 23 of Article X of the Oklahoma Constitution. The State Board of Equalization shall send written notice of the adjustment to each county assessor.

THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:

This measure amends the Oklahoma Constitution. It amends Section 8C of Article 10. It would raise the maximum income level for any individual head of household who is 65 years of age or older in order to qualify for the limit on the fair cash value of the homestead. The income level from all sources would be raised from \$25,000.00 to \$30,000.00. The amount would also be adjusted each year. The adjustments would be based on economic changes as reflected in the Consumer Price Index. The annual adjustment would be confirmed by the State Board of Equalization. Each county assessor would be notified of the adjustment. This measure would take effect on January 1, 2001.
