## GENERAL ORDER

**HB 2725** by Thornbrugh of the House and Smith of the Senate was read and considered.

Representative Thornbrugh moved to amend **HB 2725** by striking the title, the enacting clause and the entire measure and inserting in lieu thereof a floor substitute, which amendment was declared adopted. (Xerox copies for Members)

Representative Boyd moved to amend the floor substitute, Page 9 by inserting a new Section 4 to read as follows and renumbering subsequent sections:

“SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6060.9 of Title 36, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Any health benefit plan that is offered, issued or renewed in this state on or after January 1, 2001, that provides medical and surgical benefits with respect to the treatment of cancer and other conditions treated by chemotherapy or radiation therapy shall provide coverage for wigs or other scalp prostheses necessary for the comfort and dignity of the covered person.

B. The coverage provided for by this section shall be subject to the same annual deductibles, copayments, or coinsurance limits as established for all other covered benefits under the health benefit plan.

C. A health benefit plan shall provide notice to each insured or enrollee under such plan regarding the coverage required by this section in the plan's evidence of coverage, and shall provide additional written notice of the coverage to the insured or enrollee as follows:

1. In the next mailing made by the plan to the insured or enrolled employee;
2. As part of any yearly informational packet sent to the enrollee; or
3. Not later than December 1, 2000, whichever is earlier.

D. As used in this act, “health benefit plan” means any plan or arrangement as defined in subsection D of Section 6060.8 of Title 36 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

E. The Insurance Commissioner shall promulgate any rules necessary to implement the provisions of this section.”.

Representative Boyd moved to amend her amendment, by inserting in Subsection D. after the period following the word “Statutes” the language “However, this section shall not apply to policies or certificates issued to individuals or groups with fifty (50) or fewer employees.”, which amendment was declared adopted.

Representative Boyd moved to amend her amendment, by inserting in Subsection A. after the word “plan” and before the word “that” the language “, including the State and Education Employees Group Health Insurance Plan,” which amendment was declared adopted.

Representative Boyd moved to amend her amendment, by inserting in Subsection B after the word “plan” and before the period “.” the language “not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00)”, which amendment was declared adopted.

Representative Boyd moved adoption of her amendment to the floor substitute, as amended, which motion was declared adopted.

Representative Thornbrugh moved that **HB 2725** be advanced from General Order, which motion was declared adopted.
