WHEREAS, Bob E. Jones was born November 12, 1936, to Lowell and Elva Jones, in Nash, Oklahoma. He graduated from Nash High School and attended Phillips University and Graduate Seminary where he received a Bachelor of Arts and a Bachelor of Divinity. Bob Jones was ordained in 1961 and served as Associate Minister at the First Christian Church of Lawton; and

WHEREAS, following his career in the ministry, he was selected as Executive Director of the Oklahoma Osteopathic Association (OOA) where he served for 30 years before his retirement in December 1999. As Executive Director of the Oklahoma Osteopathic Association, Bob Jones received the George Nigh Association Executive of the Year Award presented by the Oklahoma Society of Association Executives. Bob Jones was presented with the 1999 Helen Gardner Osteopathic Executive Leadership Award from the Foundation for Osteopathic Services at their annual meeting. This was only the second time this award has been given by this group. Bob Jones was awarded the Distinguished Service Certificate from the American Osteopathic Association at its 1999 annual meeting. Bob Jones also authored the books “The Difference a DO Makes” and “Osteopathic Medicine: The Premier Profession”; and

WHEREAS, Bob Jones served on many professional boards including the Board of Trustees of the Donna Nigh Foundation for the Developmentally Disabled, Governor of the Oklahoma State University Foundation, Secretary/Treasurer of the Oklahoma Educational Foundation for Osteopathic Medicine, Advisor to the American Osteopathic Association Council on Federal Health Programs, Oklahoma Physician Manpower Training Commission, American Society of Association Executives, and the Association of Osteopathic State Executive Directors; and

WHEREAS, Bob Jones was an original member of the “OK-4” Barbershop Quartet and a member of the New Covenant Christian Church of Oklahoma City; and

WHEREAS, Bob Jones passed away, February 3, 2000.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 47TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:
