Section 85.9D A. Except as otherwise provided in subsection B of this section, agencies within the executive branch shall coordinate acquisition of computer software maintenance and hardware maintenance contracts through the Purchasing Division of the Department of Central Services. The Purchasing Division may establish consolidation contracts and enterprise agreements for state agencies. The State Purchasing Director may negotiate consolidation contracts ~~and~~ enterprise agreements and high technology system contracts in lieu of or in conjunction with bidding procedures to reduce acquisition cost.

B. The provisions of this section shall not apply to the Northeast Oklahoma Public Facilities Authority.”
