

ENGROSSED HOUSE AMENDMENT  
TO  
ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 661

An Act relating to schools; amending Section 9, Chapter 320, O.S.L. 1999 (70 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 3-134), which relates to charter schools; deeming certain arbitrators and mediators to be state employees for limited purpose; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Strike the title, enacting clause and entire bill and insert

"( schools - cooperation of certain entities -  
materials for training - requiring certain  
meetings - codification - effective date -  
emergency )

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1210.196 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The Oklahoma Board of Nursing, working in cooperation with the State Department of Health, Maternal and Child Health Service, Child and Adolescent Health Division, and certified school nurses employed by individual school districts using the American Diabetes Association Clinical Practice Recommendations position statement on the "Care of Children with Diabetes in the School and Daycare Setting" shall develop and have available guidelines and materials

for the training of school employees, designated by the principal, in the care needed for students with diabetes. Training shall be completed annually prior to the beginning of each school year at each school site attended by one or more students with diabetes or as needed when a student is newly enrolled at school or a student is newly diagnosed with diabetes. Training shall occur within twenty (20) days of enrollment or diagnosis. The parent, child, district-employed certified school nurse, any nursing personnel employed by a local health department assigned to a public or charter school, or subcontracted school nurse shall meet prior to the commencement of each school year to review physician orders and to develop an Individualized Diabetes Health Care Plan in accordance with the American Diabetes Association Clinical Practice Recommendations position statement on the "Care of Children with Diabetes in the School and Daycare Setting". This document shall provide the school with guidance for training staff and response to the management of diabetes treatment protocols established by the physician for that student.

B. The designated diabetes care providers, the diabetes trainer, school, school board, school district, school employee or approved trainer shall not be held civilly liable for the providing of care in accordance with the approved written protocol, in accordance with the written orders from the student's physician, and with the written authorization of the student's parent or guardian, in accordance with Section 1-116.2 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1210.196a of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Upon written request of the parent or guardian and authorization by the physician of the student, a student with diabetes shall be permitted to perform blood glucose tests, administer insulin through

the insulin delivery system the student uses, treat hypoglycemia and hyperglycemia, and otherwise attend to the care and management of diabetes of the student in the classroom, in any area of the school or school grounds, and at any school-related activity, and to possess on the student at all times all necessary supplies and equipment to perform these monitoring and treatment functions.

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2001.

SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval."
