An Act relating to public health and safety; making legislative findings; amending Section 1, Chapter 142, O.S.L. 2000, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 330, O.S.L. 2000 (21 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 841.5), which relates to medical micropigmentation; modifying definition; modifying the individuals who may apply or perform micropigmentation; providing for legislative findings; creating the Oklahoma Medical Micropigmentation Regulation Act; giving the State Department of Health regulatory authority; providing for promulgation of rules by the State Board of Health; providing for content; prohibiting certain acts; providing requirements for certificates to perform medical micropigmentation; requiring the State Board of Career and Technology Education to provide certain training and testing programs; providing for content and standards; establishing an advisory committee; providing membership and duties; providing for travel reimbursement; setting fees; providing for penalties; authorizing administrative penalties; making certain acts unlawful; providing for reinstatement; providing for deposit and expenditure of penalties collected; providing for procedures under Administrative Procedures Act; providing penalties; authorizing a temporary permit with requirements and limitations; amending 21 O.S. 1991, Sections 841 and 842, which relate to penalties for tattooing; adding to exemptions; clarifying references; providing for codification; providing for recodification; and declaring an emergency.
