An Act relating to economic development; amending Section 7, Chapter 300, O.S.L. 2001, which relates to expenditure amounts; modifying certain expenditure requirements; requiring certain revisions of budget work program; requiring certain transfers; providing purposes; providing lapse dates; requiring and prohibiting certain practices; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

OKLAHOMA DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 7, Chapter 300, O.S.L. 2001, is amended to read as follows:

Section 7. From all appropriations to the Department of Commerce for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2002, the following amounts shall be expended, subject to the availability of funds in the following categories and amounts:

Notwithstanding any other requirements provided by law, categories and amounts authorized by this section shall be exempt from the Central Purchasing Act.

SECTION 2. On the effective date of this act the Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall submit a revised budget work program for FY-02 which shall be consistent with the budget categories and amounts established by the Department prior to January 11, 2002, and in Section 1 of this act.

SECTION 3. TRANSFER The Director of the Office of State finance on the effective date of this act shall transfer the sum of One Hundred Sixty-three Thousand Seven Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$163,780.00) from the Oklahoma Housing Trust Fund created in Section 2901.2 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes to the Rural Economic Action Plan Fund of the State Treasury for the purpose of implementing the provisions of Sections 2006 through 2013 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 4. TRANSFER The Director of the Office of State Finance on the effective date of this act shall transfer the sum of Forty-seven Thousand Five Hundred Fifty-five Dollars (\$47,555.00) from the Oklahoma Housing Trust Fund created in Section 2901.2 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes to the Oklahoma Water Resources Board for the purpose of implementing the provisions of Section 2003 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 5. Appropriations made by this act, not including appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2002 (hereafter FY-02), or may be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003 (hereafter FY-03). Funds budgeted for FY-02 may be encumbered only through June 30, 2002, and must be expended by November 15, 2002. Any funds

remaining after November 15, 2002, and not budgeted for FY-03, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year. Funds budgeted for FY-03 may be encumbered only through June 30, 2003. Any funds remaining after November 15, 2003, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year. These appropriations may not be budgeted in both fiscal years simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-02, and not required to pay obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted for FY-03, after the agency to which the funds have been appropriated has prepared and submitted a budget work program revision removing these funds from the FY-02 budget work program and after such revision has been approved by the Office of State Finance.

SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
