A Concurrent Resolution memorializing Pearl Harbor;
designating portion of United States Highway 169 as
the Pearl Harbor Memorial Expressway; directing
Oklahoma Department of Transportation to place
permanent markers; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, the surprise attack of Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, on the
morning of December 7, 1941, forever changed the history of the
world; and

WHEREAS, the attack on Pearl Harbor resulted in the death of
2,403 servicemen and civilians, the wounding of 1,178 servicemen and
civilians, damaged or destroyed eight battleships, destroyed 188
airplanes, and further affected the lives of every American family;
and

WHEREAS, the U.S.S. Oklahoma was one of the ships to perish on that infamous day; and

WHEREAS, the attack on Pearl Harbor will forever be indelible on the minds and hearts of all Americans;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 48TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the portion of United States Highway 169 beginning at Memorial Road extending northerly to the Tulsa County line be designated as "Pearl Harbor Memorial Expressway".

THAT the Oklahoma Department of Transportation shall cause permanent suitable markers to be placed upon the expressway bearing the name.

THAT copies of this resolution be distributed to Neal McCaleb, Secretary and Director of Transportation, to the members of the State Transportation Commission, and to Arles Cole of the Last Man's Club.
