A Concurrent Resolution mourning the loss of the late Charles Schusterman; praising his philanthropic work and consoling his family; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, Charles Schusterman was among the most distinguished alumni of the University of Oklahoma and a successful businessman who led Samson Investment Company; and

WHEREAS, Charles Schusterman and his wife Lynn were dedicated philanthropists supporting a wide variety of causes on the local, state, national, and international levels. These causes included education, children, community service, Jewish organizations, and medical research. The Charles and Lynn Schusterman Family Foundation set an example of philanthropic endeavors that has greatly benefited all Oklahomans; and

WHEREAS, the Schusterman family has been honored numerous times from a variety of sources including the 1996 Maimonides Award from the Jewish Federation of Tulsa, the 1996 Humanitarian Award from the National Jewish Medical and Research Center, and the 1998 Annual Award from the National Conference for Community and Justice; and

WHEREAS, the Schusterman family was honored by the University of Oklahoma Board of Regents by having the "Schusterman Health Sciences Center at the University of Oklahoma in Tulsa" named after them in appreciation for their many contributions. The 2nd Session of the 47th Legislature passed a Senate Concurrent Resolution honoring Charles and Lynn Schusterman; and

WHEREAS, Charles Schusterman, prominent philanthropist, successful businessman, and international Jewish leader died Saturday, December 31, 2000, at the age of 65.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 48TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature joins family and friends in mourning the loss of Charles Schusterman.

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature praises the philanthropic work of Charles Schusterman, offers consolation to the family, and observes that his contributions to the State of Oklahoma are appreciated by the entire state and will be appreciated by generations to come.

THAT a copy of this resolution be distributed to Lynn Schusterman, the Charles and Lynn Schusterman Family Foundation, and the Schusterman Health Sciences Center at the University of Oklahoma in Tulsa.
