An Act relating to reappropriation of public funds; making reappropriations to the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department, the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs, the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services and the Department of Human Services; making reappropriations nonfiscal; stating lapse period; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. REAPPROPRIATION The amount of Twelve Million Seven Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$12,780,000.00) originally appropriated to the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department by Section 66, Chapter 189, O.S.L. 1993, from the proceeds of the sale of bonds deposited in the Oklahoma Building Bonds of 1992 Fund (A) in the State Treasury for the construction, furnishing and equipping of new buildings, for equipping, remodeling, modernizing and repairing existing buildings, and for other capital expenditures, as reappropriated by Section 41, Chapter 275, O.S.L. 1995, and continued and reappropriated by Section 41, Chapter 270, O.S.L. 1997, and continued and reappropriated by Section 13, Chapter 352, O.S.L. 1999, is hereby continued and reappropriated to the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department in the original amount and for the original purposes, as adjusted by transfer, less the amounts that have been expended as of the effective date of this act.

SECTION 2. REAPPROPRIATION The amount of Sixteen Million Four Hundred Thirty-two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$16,432,500.00) originally appropriated to the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs by Section 75, Chapter 189, O.S.L. 1993, from the proceeds of the sale of bonds deposited in the Oklahoma Building Bonds of 1992 Fund (A) in the State Treasury for the construction, furnishing and equipping of new buildings, for equipping, remodeling, modernizing and repairing existing buildings, and for other capital expenditures, as reappropriated by Section 48, Chapter 275, O.S.L. 1995, and continued and reappropriated by Section 48, Chapter 270, O.S.L. 1997, and continued and reappropriated by Section 17, Chapter 352, O.S.L. 1999, is hereby continued and reappropriated to the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs in the original amount and for the original purposes, as adjusted by transfer, less the amounts that have been expended as of the effective date of this act.

SECTION 3. REAPPROPRIATION The amount of Six Million Dollars (\$6,000,000.00) originally appropriated to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services by Section 108, Chapter 189, O.S.L. 1993, from the proceeds of the sale of bonds deposited in the Oklahoma Building Bonds of 1992 Fund (B) in the State Treasury for the construction, furnishing and equipping of new buildings, for equipping, remodeling, modernizing and repairing existing buildings, and for other capital expenditures, as reappropriated by Section 74, Chapter 275, O.S.L. 1995, and continued and reappropriated by Section 74, Chapter 270, O.S.L. 1997, and continued and reappropriated by Section 29, Chapter 352, O.S.L. 1999, is hereby continued and reappropriated to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services in the original amount and for the original purposes, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 363, O.S.L. 1993, as adjusted by transfer, less the amounts that have been expended as of the effective date of this act.

SECTION 4. REAPPROPRIATION The amount of Five Million Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$5,300,000.00) originally appropriated to the Department of Human Services by Section 110, Chapter 189, O.S.L. 1993, from the proceeds of the sale of bonds deposited in the Oklahoma Building Bonds of 1992 Fund (B) in the State Treasury for the construction, furnishing and equipping of new buildings, for equipping, remodeling, modernizing and repairing existing buildings, and for other capital expenditures, as reappropriated by Section 75, Chapter 275, O.S.L. 1995, and continued and reappropriated by Section 75, Chapter 270, O.S.L. 1997, and continued and reappropriated by Section 30, Chapter 352, O.S.L. 1999, is hereby continued and reappropriated to the Department of Human Services in the original amount and for the original purposes, as adjusted by transfer, less the amounts that have been expended as of the effective date of this act.

SECTION 5. REAPPROPRIATION The amount of Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000.00) originally appropriated to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services by Section 120, Chapter 189, O.S.L. 1993, from the proceeds of the sale of bonds deposited in the Oklahoma Building Bonds of 1992 Fund (B) in the State Treasury for the construction, furnishing and equipping of new buildings, for equipping, remodeling, modernizing and repairing existing buildings, and for other capital expenditures, as reappropriated by Section 84, Chapter 275, O.S.L. 1995, and continued and reappropriated by Section 84, Chapter 270, O.S.L. 1997, and continued and reappropriated by Section 33, Chapter 352, O.S.L. 1999, for the Center for Pregnant Women with Substance Abuse located in Tulsa, Oklahoma, is hereby continued and reappropriated to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services in the original amount and for the original purposes, as adjusted by transfer, less the amounts that have been expended as of the effective date of this act.

SECTION 6. The appropriations made by this act shall not be subject to fiscal year limitations and shall be available for encumbrance and expenditure purposes for a period of thirty (30) months from the date this act is approved.

SECTION 7. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby

declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
