A Concurrent Resolution relating to rules of the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation; waiving the thirty-legislative-day review period for proposed permanent rule OAC 800:25-7-12, relating to the creation of a statewide pheasant season and proposed revocation of permanent rule OAC 800:25-7-13, relating to pheasant hunting in Oklahoma counties except the Panhandle; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 308 of Title 75 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the Legislature may waive the thirty-legislative-day review period for any rule which has been transmitted for legislative review; and

WHEREAS, on April 4, 2001, the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation submitted to the Legislature for its review, proposed amendments to proposed permanent rule OAC 800:25-7-12, relating to the creation of a statewide pheasant season and proposed revocation of permanent rule OAC 800:25-7-13, relating to pheasant hunting in Oklahoma counties except the Panhandle; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes the substantive value and importance of such proposed amendments to permanent rule OAC 800:25-7-12 and proposed revocation of permanent rule OAC 800:25-7-13.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 48TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Legislature hereby waives the thirty-legislative-day review period of proposed amendments to permanent rule OAC 800:25-7-12 and proposed revocation of permanent rule OAC 800:25-7-13.

THAT copies of this resolution shall be distributed to the Governor, the Executive Director of the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation and the Editor of "The Oklahoma Register".
