A Resolution recognizing the importance of the Cyber Corps program; extending welcome to the participants of the 2002 Cyber Corps Symposium; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, America's Cyber Corps is a new federal government program that trains students in computer security, in exchange for government service, to form the country's first line of defense against Internet hackers and terrorists; and

WHEREAS, under the Cyber Corps program, selected university students receive two years of intense training, at the end of which they will receive a bachelor's or master's degree in computer science and will then serve for two years as a computer security specialist for the federal government and military; and

WHEREAS, the University of Tulsa is one of six schools in the nation selected to train the elite squadrons of computer security experts through the Cyber Corps program; and

WHEREAS, on July 20 through 24, 2002, more than seventy students from universities across the country will be attending the 2002 Cyber Corps Symposium which will be held at the University of Tulsa; and

WHEREAS, on July 21, 2002, the Oklahoma Legislature will host participants of the 2002 Cyber Corps Symposium at the Oklahoma City National Memorial; and

WHEREAS, Cyber Corps is a unique program that will serve as an important part of America's war on terrorism.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 48TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

THAT the Oklahoma House of Representatives recognizes the importance of the Cyber Corps program in America's war on terrorism and the unique opportunity it offers students in the program to receive specialized training and to serve our country through government service.

THAT the Oklahoma House of Representatives extends its welcome to the participants of the 2002 Cyber Corps Symposium to be held July 20 through 24, 2002, at the University of Tulsa.

THAT copies of this resolution be distributed to the University of Tulsa which shall provide copies to the participants of the 2002 Cyber Corps Symposium.
