An Act relating to the State Election Board; making appropriations; stating purposes; requiring transfer of certain funds; requiring budgeting in certain categories and amounts; requiring performance measures; providing for duties and compensation of employees; limiting the salary of the Secretary; making certain appropriations nonfiscal; providing lapse dates; requiring certain budget procedures; prohibiting certain budget procedures; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

STATE ELECTION BOARD

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the State Election Board from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, the sum of Six Million Two Hundred Seventy-nine Thousand One Hundred Fifty-three Dollars (\$6,279,153.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the State Election Board by law.

SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated to the State Election Board from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2001, the sum of Nine Hundred Forty-eight Thousand Two Hundred Twenty-seven Dollars (\$948,227.00) or so much thereof as may be required to pay the necessary expenses of holding elections.

SECTION 3. TRANSFER On the effective date of this act, the Director of State Finance shall transfer the sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) of the amount of Seven Million Six Hundred Seven Thousand Seven Hundred Sixty-eight Dollars (\$7,607,768.00) originally appropriated to the State Election Board by Section 1, Chapter 268, O.S.L. 2001, from any monies in the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2002, not otherwise appropriated, for duties imposed upon the State Election Board by law, to the Special Cash Fund of the State Treasury.

SECTION 4. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, the State Election Board shall budget all funds in the following categories and amounts:

The agency shall develop outcome-based performance measures for each budget category.

SECTION 5. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the State Election Board by law shall be set by the State Election Board. The salary of the Secretary of the State Election Board shall not exceed Seventy Three Thousand Nine Hundred Fifty-seven Dollars (\$73,957.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003.

SECTION 6. Appropriations made by this act, not including appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003 (hereafter FY-03), or may be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004 (hereafter FY-04). Funds budgeted for FY-03 may be encumbered only through June 30, 2003, and must be expended by November 15, 2003. Any funds remaining after November 15, 2003, and not budgeted for FY-04, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year. Funds budgeted for FY-04 may be encumbered only through June 30, 2004. Any funds remaining after November 15, 2004, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year. These appropriations may not be budgeted in both fiscal years simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-03, and not required to pay obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted for FY-04, after the agency to which the funds have been appropriated has prepared and submitted a budget work program revision removing these funds from the FY-03 budget work program and after such revision has been approved by the Office of State Finance.

SECTION 7. This act shall become effective July 1, 2002.

SECTION 8. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
