An Act relating to the J.M. Davis Memorial Commission; amending Section 9 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 203 of the 1st Session of the 48th Oklahoma Legislature, which relates to the J.M. Davis Memorial Commission; modifying the salary limits of the Chief Administrative Officer; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 9 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 203 of the 1st Session of the 48th Oklahoma Legislature, is amended to read as follows:

Section 9. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the J.M. Davis Memorial Commission by law shall be set by the Chief Administrative Officer of the J.M. Davis Memorial Commission. The salary of the Chief Administrative Officer shall not exceed ~~Forty-eight Thousand One Hundred Fifty-nine Dollars (\$48,159.00)~~ Seventy-two Thousand Dollars (\$72,000.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2002. The J.M. Davis Memorial Commission for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2002, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2001.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby

declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
