A Resolution mourning the loss of Dr. James "Jim"
Russell Rhymer; extending condolences to his family
and friends; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, Dr. James "Jim" Russell Rhymer was born to Harold and
Sibyl (Ratliff) Rhymer on September 23, 1928, in Clinton, Oklahoma.
He was brought up and attended school in Leedey, Oklahoma,
graduating from Leedey High School in 1946; and

WHEREAS, Jim Rhymer attended Southwestern State College of
Pharmacy and later went to the University of Pittsburgh College of
Medicine. Jim served his internship at St. Luke's Hospital in
Denver, Colorado, and then returned to Oklahoma, establishing a
practice in Clinton, Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Rhymer served as a civilian doctor at Clinton-
Sherman Air Force Base, as a Captain in the Oklahoma National Guard,
and as team doctor for the Clinton High School and Southwestern
Oklahoma State University football programs; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Rhymer was a member of the Oklahoma State Medical
Licensure Board, Custer County Medical Society, and the Oklahoma
Peer Review Committee. Jim served as Chief of Staff for Oklahoma
General Hospital and Clinton Regional Hospital; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Jim Rhymer was doctor of the Oklahoma Highway
Patrol Cadet Lawman Academy and served as a Doctor of the Day for
the Oklahoma State Legislature on numerous occasions over the past
twenty years. Dr. Rhymer died on Wednesday, February 27, 2002, at
Clinton Regional Hospital.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 48TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
