A Resolution honoring Rollo D. Redburn for his distinguished service to the State of Oklahoma as Budget Director in the Office of State Finance; recognizing him as an outstanding public employee; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, Rollo D. Redburn started his public service career as a Budget Analyst Trainee with the Office of State Finance (OSF) in August, 1976. At that time OSF provided fiscal staff support to the Governor's Office as well as to the House and Senate. Rollo advanced over the next several years and moved into his present position as the Director of the Budget Division in July, 1985; and

WHEREAS, Rollo has served as Director of the Budget for four different Governors - Keating, Walters, Bellmon, and Nigh. He assisted each in learning the state's budgeting process, evaluating the impact of legislation, and identifying ways to improve government; and

WHEREAS, Rollo guides a professional staff of budget analysts each year in the preparation of the Governor's budget recommendations and has received the Distinguished Budget Presentation Award from the Government Finance Officers Association for the past four years. He also serves on the Executive Committee of the National Association of State Budget Officers; and

WHEREAS, Rollo goes above and beyond his job duties often working late hours to provide the state's leadership with the information needed to make well-informed decisions. Through his many years of service, he has gained a vast and irreplaceable knowledge of state government and has made an outstanding contribution to Oklahoma through his dedicated leadership in this

role and his efforts to make state government more efficient and effective; and

WHEREAS, Rollo D. Redburn lives in The Village, Oklahoma, with his wife, Annette and their three children: Abbey, Phillip, and Michael.
