A Resolution praising the private life and public career of Edgar A. "Ed" Kellogg; extending best wishes upon the occasion of his retirement; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, Edgar A. "Ed" Kellogg is a native of Daisy, Oklahoma. He graduated from Stringtown High School in 1966 and from Oklahoma State University with a civil engineering degree in 1971. Ed joined the Oklahoma Department of Transportation as an Engineer-in-Training after working part-time in the Rural Design Squad at Oklahoma State University in 1971; and

WHEREAS, Ed Kellogg spent eight years at Division Two in Antlers, Oklahoma, before starting his own land surveying and consulting engineering company in 1979. He also worked for the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation and as City Engineer at Ardmore, Oklahoma, before becoming the Oklahoma Department of Transportation Resident Engineer there in 1986; and

WHEREAS, Ed Kellogg later became Assistant Division Engineer for the Transportation Department's southwest division headquartered in Duncan, Oklahoma, before becoming the Assistant Division Engineer at the Tulsa Headquarters. In 1991 he became the Division Engineer; and

WHEREAS, Ed Kellogg is past President of the Antlers Chamber of Commerce and served as a member of its Board of Directors. Other community and civic involvements include serving as a member of the Executive Council of the Tri-County Industrial Development Authority for southeastern Oklahoma and as a member of Toastmasters International. Ed has been a member of the National Society of

Professional Engineers and the American Public Works Association;

WHEREAS, Ed Kellogg has been a pilot for over 30 years and enjoys flying. An active member of the First Baptist Church in Talala, Oklahoma, Ed often goes on church missions overseas and enjoys a wide variety of sports and athletic activities; and

WHEREAS, Ed Kellogg plans to retire from the Department of Transportation in November of this year. He has served the people of Oklahoma well and has been a great asset to the Department of Transportation and State of Oklahoma. He will be greatly missed by all.
