HOUSE BILL HB1271

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to crimes and punishments;  
establishing crime of committing felony while out on  
bond; establishing penalty; requiring sentence to run  
consecutive with other sentences; providing for  
codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 593 of Title 21, unless there is  
created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Any person, who while out on bond for a pending criminal charge,  
commits a felony, shall be guilty of a felony and upon conviction  
shall be punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department  
of Corrections for a period of not less than one (1) nor more than  
ten (10) years, to be served consecutively to any sentence imposed  
for the original crime for which the person was out on bond and in  
addition to any penalty imposed for the crime committed while out on  
bond.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2001.
